**FIRST COMMERCIAL  
TENANT SIGNED  
FOR THE VILLAGE  
CENTRE**

A new premium Young's pub is set to open its doors to the residents of Kidbrooke Village after becoming the first commercial tenant to sign with Berkeley Homes at the development in the Royal Borough of Greenwich. Due to open in 2018, the as-yet-unnamed pub will be a welcome addition to the development, sitting at the heart of Kidbrooke Village, in the new commercial centre.

The 4,700 sq. ft. pub will be in close vicinity to the revamped Kidbrooke station, which is set to open in 2017. The bar and dining areas will look out onto a landscaped central piazza where visitors will be able to access a wealth of other amenities, including leisure facilities, community spaces and retail stores, as well as acres of green space and parkland.

Patrick Dardis, Chief Executive of Young's, said: "We're delighted to have been chosen as the first bar and restaurant to sign at Kidbrooke Village. Young's pubs are thoughtfully

designed to be a venue for everyone – whether it's families looking to share a meal or for friends looking to have a catch-up over a couple of drinks – and having worked closely with Berkeley in recent years we know that this neighbourhood is the perfect location for our high quality offer."

**CHRISTMAS AT KIDBROOKE VILLAGE**


**On Saturday 19 November**

**WORKS START ON NEW SITE FOR WINGFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL IN THE ROYAL BOROUGH**

Children and teachers from Wingfield Primary School came together on 23 September with representatives from the Education Funding Agency, Berkeley Homes and Galliford Try to mark the start of construction works on the new building for Wingfield Primary School, in Kidbrooke Village.

As part of the Royal Borough of Greenwich's vision to regenerate the Kidbrooke area and rebuild on the former Ferrier Estate, Berkeley Homes was given planning consent for their Kidbrooke Village scheme, which included an agreement with the Council to provide a site for a new school.

In Blackheath Quarter, the school will be built by Galliford Try. The expansion of the school will enable three-form entry when it opens in September 2017, which is earlier than planned.

Councillor Miranda Williams, Cabinet Member for Children and Young People at the Royal Borough of Greenwich, said: "A new school site is such a fantastic opportunity to create something special, and designed specifically for the pupils and staff who will be using it.

The new site will offer brand new facilities including a Market Garden and 'Forest School' outside learning environment – how fantastic is that for inspiring our young learners! I really can't wait to come back and see it when it is completed next year."

**BERKELEY RAISES £45,000 FOR DEMELZA CHILDREN'S HOSPICE**

Berkeley Homes East Thames raised £45,000 for Demelza Children's Hospice on Friday 9 September when it hosted its annual five-a-side football competition.

**RESIDENTS GET WILD IN KIDBROOKE**


