

OVER 700 people enjoyed Berkeley Homes' third annual Kidbrooke Village Fete in the sunshine, which featured a range of live music acts, craft stalls, free games and fairground rides on Saturday 18 July.

The newly elected Mayor of the Royal Borough of Greenwich, Councillor Norman Adams attended the event in the newly created Cator Park, and said: "The sun is shining, people have got big smiles on their faces and they are happy and enjoying themselves.

Visitors were treated to a performance from local band 'The Swifty Barnets' who are currently pupils at the nearby St Thomas More Catholic Comprehensive School in Eltham. Local microbrewers, Hop Stuff Brewery, based at Berkeley's Royal Arsenal Riverside development in Woolwich, served up some cool beverages next to the popular hog roast stall, Hogs and Kisses.

In the kids section of the fete, the tea cup ride was a spinning success along with the swing chairs, coconut shy, bouncycastle and hook-a-duck. Kidbrooke Village OneSpace community were also on hand and held a shoot-the-hoop competition.
