KIDBROOKE PARK ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

You should have recently received notification from Transport for London (TfL) regarding the Kidbrooke Park Road improvements which will be taking place from **Sunday 25 June until 3 September.**

The works will restrict vehicles from

travelling north to Rochester Way from Birdbrooke Road. South bound access will be maintained to Birdbrooke Road from Rochester Way.

This change will be in place to discourage through traffic travelling on local streets during the closure of the Kidbrooke Park Road.


Diversions and signs are in place but we advise that you plan ahead and alert family and friends if they are visiting to

Vehicle and pedestrian access to properties will be maintained at all times.

Parking will also be suspended on Birdbrooke Road near the junction with Rochester Way during the course of works.

### BERKELEY TO WORK IN PARTNERSHIP WITH BLACKHEATH RUGBY CLUB

Berkeley Homes is pleased to announce a partnership with the oldest open rugby club in the world, Blackheath Rugby Club which has been around since 1858.

The club rightfully takes its place in the history books as both a founding member of the Football Association and the Rugby Football Union - one of only seven founding members to have survived to this day.

The Club (as it is known throughout the World) is proud to boast sides from 1st XV through to 5th XV. The Club also has a veterans' side as well as two women's teams and junior squads from under six through to its under 18.

More recently in its history, the Club has established a very successful Rugby Academy. It hopes both to be promoted to the championship and raise the profile of the grass roots of rugby.

Last season the club moved its 1st XV games from the Rectory Field in Charlton

Blackheath Rugby Club has invested money to make sure its new home can host both community and national league rugby and respond to higher levels of participation.

Improvements include a new Premiership-quality pitch, new players' facilities, a new spectator's stand with adjoining bar and catering facilities as well as state of the art LED floodlighting



The Blackheath 1st XV team plays rugby in National League One – the RFU third tier competition behind the Premiership and Championship. Last season was the first year the team played National League rugby at Well



Hall, and they were delighted with the progress they made playing in their new home. In the 2016/17 season the move to Well Hall saw the club increase its membership and the average crowd size increased too with up to 1,200 fans through the turnstiles.

In the forthcoming 2017/2018 season Blackheath Rugby is looking forward to continuing the success of the 2016/17 season and are looking to expand its local membership base.

#### Club 7s Tournament

On the 8th July Blackheath Rugby Club is holding its inaugural Club 7s tournament. The day will begin with the Lions Test on TV, followed by the over 30s men's and women's teams competing across four tournaments from 10am. This shortened, fast-moving game is sure to be a great summer's day out. Entry is just £8.
